# Stephen Hawking 8<sup>th</sup> January 1942 14<sup>th</sup> March 2018

"The past, like the future, is indefinite and exists only as a spectrum of possibilities." - Stephen Hawking

Steven Hawking (a British Scientist) famed mostly for his work on black holes passed away at his home in Cambridge peacefully on the 14th March 2018, aged 76. During his lifetime, he was diagnosed with Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis and was told he only had 2 - 3 years to live, but managed to live to 76. He achieved a longer future to help the world so he ran far beyond the small spectrum. His positivity and hard work will continue to have a positive impact on the world forever.

Stephen Hawking was a genius. He was the first person to discover the true secret of black holes and that it is possible to see them, however not with the naked eye. Parents' Association BGS Parents' Association (BGSPA) has yet again been able to secure reduced price ride wristbands for Adventure Island, Southend. Adventure Island is a great day out for all the family, with a wide choice of rides for all ages. Check it out at: <a href="https://www.adventureisland.co.uk">www.adventureisland.co.uk</a>

Although entry is free, purchase of a wristband is required for unlimited use of all suitable rides. Once purchased, a wristband can be used on any one

day in 2018 that Adventure Island is open. At peak times (weekends and school holidays), for anyone who is over 1.2 metres tall, a wristband would cost £22.50 if purchased online (£30 if purchased at the ticket office on the day). The PA can provide these for **only £18.00**. For those who are 1.2 metres tall, or less, we have wristbands for **only £12**, instead of the usual £18.75 online price (£25 if purchased at the ticket office on the day).


