Anger Management for young people

Our Anger Management support service is for young people aged 8 to 17 years and can be delivered one-to-one behaviour support or group workshops.

Anger Management One-to-One Support

The one-to-one support service gives young people the freedom and safety to explore their own anger management on a more personal level. After an initial assessment has been made, weekly one-to-one support sessions will take place. We charge £40 per session for this behavioural support and all our meetings take place at the North Cray Neighbourhood Centre which is neutral ground for most families.

Anger Management Group Sessions

Anger Management sessions are designed for groups of up to 6 young people and are structured across six, 1 hour sessions. Each session costs £60 per group. The sessions look at the causes and triggers of anger and provides young people with the tools necessary to control anger.


