ECM Day News

'Suits you' winners ~ As part of their ECM day in November, Year 9 students took part in the 'Suits You' challenge. This was a competition devised by the UK's only playing card manufacturer - Richard Edwards, whereby students had to design a new set of playing cards and devise a marketing strategy for them. The aim of the project was to encourage both design initiative but also marketing desires and expertise, linking enterprise and work-related learning.

Our congratulations go to - James Yardley, Scott Evans, Lauren Purchase and Emily Hoang, the BGS team who won the competition. On Monday the Marketing Manager of Richard Edwards, Louisa Moger came into school to give an assembly to Year 9, giving information about the challenge and presenting the winning team with their certificate.

The prize is fourfold:

- The winning team will work with the design department at Richard Edwards to produce the graphical work from their initial designs and see the cards through production, receiving the first 4 packs off the production line as a keepsake, a very exciting opportunity for anyone interested in working in design production or marketing.
- The whole of 9 MEH will have the opportunity to see round the Richard Edwards factory.
- The designs produced by James, Scott, Lauren and Emily will be exhibited permanently in the Guildhall Library in the City of London which is open to public display and is the place where all past and present playing card designs are

housed and displayed.

- The school will receive 50 packs of playing cards to sell once the cards are in production, with James, Scott, Emily and Lauren deciding on a marketing strategy, selling price and recipient for the profits.

Once the artwork is returned to the school it will be on display.

I am sure you will join me in congratulating Lauren, Emily, Scott and James on this superb achievement, and I hope they enjoy their prize.
