
Mr Villazon


At Bexley Grammar School we think of ourselves as a family and we look out for each other so when we see our classmates and peers struggling then we encourage you all to step up and help. There is always someone to talk to at Bexley Grammar School and the SEND department is always there to support and help.

Planner and Timetable

This is your student planner and it is the most important thing you need to help you organise yourself as a secondary school student. You will receive your planner on your first day in September.

A few key things to remember about you planner:

- 1. Bring it with you every day and have it out for every lesson
- 2. Record all of your homework in there
- 3. Get it signed by your parent(s)/guardian(s) each week so they can help you stay organised



What is a planner? And how do you use it?

A planner is used for many things - when you first arrive at school, you will be given a planner. Your name, form, and form room go on the front, so you can remember. Your teachers will give you two sheets to stick in at the back - one will be the timetable you will stick to for the rest of the year, and the other one will be a map of the school, so you can find your way if you get lost, but don't worry, the route to all of your classes will become very easy to remember.

In your planner, there are also a set of pages that you will mark any homework that you get over the course of the week down in. (Pages 41 - 119.) This is important, because you need to remember what you have to do for the homework, which class it is for, and when it is due. You will use these pages for the rest of the school year until Year 8, where you will probably get a new planner.

Close to the beginning, there are a set of yellow pages (Pages 27 - 33.) with lots of small, empty boxes that your teachers will fill in once special conditions are met. They are known as your merit pages. Merits are good. Your teachers will give you merits if you have done something outstanding. This might be saying something fluently without any mistakes in your language class, or answering a hard question including your own opinion or facts, or it might be something as simple as turning up to any clubs you have at lunchtime.

Your homework page, or your Weekly Diary as it is called, has a large box underneath. Teachers, whether you study under them or not, can write anything in there for your form tutor or your parents to look at. Or it might be something your parents write for your teacher to see, like any dentist appointments. Underneath that box, there are three lines. One will be labeled as 'Student signature' which you will need to sign, another saying 'Parent signature' which your parents need to sign, so your teachers know that they have seen any comments in the box above, and finally, 'Tutor signature'. It is important that you and your parents sign your planner every Saturday, after the week has passed. It is VERY important.

Your planner will also tell you what time everything is, who to speak to if you need advice or help, when the half terms are, and the school rules and regulations. It is valid that you take your planner wherever you go in school, and that you bring it in every day. It really helps you. Read your planner to get acquainted with everything inside!

There are 7 periods (1 for lunch!) in a school day (each are 50 minutes long), plus an Academic Monitoring (AM), which is with your Form Tutor. Bexley Grammar School has a 2 week timetable (Week A and Week B), and sometimes there are differences in what lessons are scheduled? Can you see any here?

So, what does it all mean?



The top line is the subject you will have during this lesson (In this example, History - Monday Week A and B P4 and Friday Week A and B P1). The 2 or 3 letters below the subject is the teacher code (in this instance it's me, TAM - Mr Martin!) and the letter and number is your room number (J21).

Important rules

These are a brief overview of some of the most important school rules. Please note, that these are not all of the school rules; these will be detailed in your planner.

Uniform

Uniform rules are detailed in the planner. But, 4 key things to remember:

- 1. No trainers or sport branded shoes
- 2. No jewelry
- 3. Shirts tucked in
- 4. Blazers on around school

Planner

Always have your planner with you every day and make sure you record your homework in it.

Attendance and Punctuality

The school day starts with Registration in your form room at 08:30. You should be sitting in your seat when the bell goes, ready to be registered by your form tutor. Registration finishes at 08:35.

If you are later to school than 08:35, you need to sign in with Mrs Jeffery in the Canteen and then go straight to your lesson. It is vitally important that you are on time to school, otherwise you will miss valuable learning time.

If you are not well, your parent(s)/guardian(s) need to contact Mrs Jeffery to explain why.

Mobile Phone

You are allowed to bring your mobile phone to school. However, between 08:30 and 15:05, your phone should be switched off and in your bag or blazer pocket. This includes break and lunchtime.

PE Kit

PE uniform rules are detailed in the planner. Ensure you have the correct PE Kit for your PE lessons and make sure you change back into your proper school uniform having exercised during PE.

Canteen

The canteen serves hot and cold food for you to eat at Break and Lunch. All food purchased in the canteen must be eaten at one of the table areas inside the canteen.

Above all, be respectful and tolerant of all within the school community.

House

There are 6 Houses at Bexley Grammar School, all named after prominent teachers at BGS. They are; Collins (Red), Wellman (Orange), Kirkman (Yellow), Prothero (Green), Johnson (Blue) and Mabbs (Purple). The House competition runs annually from the beginning of the Summer Term until the end of the Spring Term, and involves some 35 or so activities at Junior, Intermediate and Senior levels. The forms in every year group (up to year 11) are each assigned to a House, the pupils in the Sixth Form maintain their House membership but are spread across several forms. Form tutors belong to the same House as their form and where possible maintain that House allegiance throughout their time at Bexley Grammar.

School badges are colour-coded to show each pupil's House, and each House has a member of staff who acts as the Head of House as well as seven selected 6th form House Captains (two senior house captains and five house captains) who are assigned by House, one to each form group. The House system promotes inclusion and community throughout the school as many events take place in mixed age and gender teams/groups. It also allows students to gain experience in leadership and healthy competition. Most importantly the students find the House system immensely fun and rewarding!

Competitions include:

- Sport netball, basketball, badminton, tennis, table tennis, football, sports day
- The Arts Music and Dance, Drama, photography
- Other: bridge, chess, quiz, planter cookery, harvest box, STEM
- And some curricular competitions too.

Wednesday's academic monitoring slot is dedicated to 'House' time, either as a House assembly, led by the Head of House, or in House Forms. For year 12 & 13 each House has two dedicated House Forms per year. It gives students and staff an opportunity to sort teams, give advance notice of events, hold mini inter-House competitions and to have time dedicated to House activities every fortnight. Each form will be expected to lead a House Assembly once per year.

In the Hall, there is an Honour Board which gives the House Winners since the competition's inception – the current champions are Kirkman, there are some House Honours boards outside K1 listing the names of Senior House Captains since 2012.

The overall House Co-ordinator is Mrs J Snelling.


