War Child "Learn to Live" Campaign Success!

In November, during an FBCS lesson, the whole Year 8 cohort learnt about the work of the charity War Child in supporting children affected by war. They learnt that 357 million children are currently living in a war zone, which is 1 in 6 children worldwide! They also learnt about the devastating effects of wars on these children's physical and mental health, and how difficult it is to provide adequate support to these children, due to lack of funding. Indeed, only 0.7% of the UK's national income is given to international aid.



In order to address this, War Child set up a campaign and asked children to write to our Prime Minister to urge her to increase the amount of money given to international aid and to charities such as War Child.

We sent a total of 84 letters, all written independently by our Year 8 students. They were added to a total of 700 letters which were delivered directly to Downing Street on the Universal Children's Day. As a result of this campaign, the UK Government has promised to provide over

11 million pounds for 12,000 refugee children and their families. There is also going to be 6.1 million pounds for refugees in Jordan and 5 million pounds for Syrian refugees in Lebanon. What is more, War Child is also going to receive up to 500,000 pounds aid match funding specifically for children residing in the Central African Republic, to support them with their mental health, in order for them to overcome their experiences and to be able to learn. This is an amazing achievement that made the Year 8s really proud, and has made them realise that they can have a real impact in the world. This is what some of them had to say about this experience:

"I believe that War Child is doing great things as saving children and helping them create a stable foundation for the rest of their life. This was very interesting and relieving for us in the classroom. We were happy to know that people out there were helping people in need and giving them the support they need. Thank you for reading this."



"I want a mobile phone and Fortnite for Christmas!"


If these are words that you have been faced with this December, please read on and take note of the following in order to keep your child safe!

Nevertheless, I ask that you refer to the diagram below which shows age restrictions for a number of Social Media Platforms. I also encourage you to monitor your child's Social Media use. Pupils make silly mistakes or poor errors of judgement resulting in them posting either too much personal information or something they regret as soon as it has been shared. With open conversation at home and transparency on Social Media use it should go some way to preventing future issues.

Fortnite! In November 2018, the popular online game had over 200 million players worldwide! This is just one of many games where pupils are able to play against and meet strangers online. The game is said to be incredibly addictive and results in pupils missing meals and staying awake until the early hours of the morning. They then attempt to go to sleep in an agitated state. 
