BGS success at the 2019 Bexley 'Speak Out' Challenge

On Thursday the 28th March the Jack Petchey 'Speak Out' Bexley Regional Final was held at St. Catherine's School for Girls.

The Jack Petchey 'Speak Out' Challenge is run by the Speakers Trust who provide workshops to **19,000** pupils every year across London. Of those pupils who take part in the workshops, a handful of those competes in a school final, the winner of which progresses to the Bexley Regional Final. I was lucky enough to be that finalist.



Upon arriving at St. Catherine's I met my fellow competitors from 15 other schools in Bexley. We had all made it this far and I could see they were all capable speakers, so it was interesting to sit with the other finalists while we introduced ourselves. After formalities we took part in a pre-competition workshop led by a member of the 'Speaker's Trust' where we discussed what made a really good speech. The workshop leader advised each of us as to where we could make small improvements to our speeches, such as using open body language, before we were led into the hall where the final would take place.

Walking into the hall I was surprisingly calm, but as time passed, that false sense of security soon left me as I found myself in a room full of eager guests, friends and family, all ready and

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waiting to listen to the speeches my fellow contestants and I had worked so hard to prepare.

Lights out. Hall quiet. Spotlight on.

One after the other, my equally anxious competitors delivered fantastic speeches on topics as varied as xenophobia, vaccinations and even superheroes. It was amazing to witness their different speaking styles, nuances and the passion they displayed. I had tough competition.

With each passing speech my turn drew closer and closer until I found myself mic'd up and walking what felt like a mile up onto stage. I was beyond nervous at this point, but breathed slowly and performed my speech "Resolutions" to the best of my ability and returned to my seat until the end of the speeches and for the judging to begin.

All of us waited restlessly for the judges to return and when they did, the room fell silent as the host announced the top 3 speeches...

"In third place, please give it up for... Kate Dairymple from Townley Grammar School".

"Please give a huge round of applause to our runner up... Samantha Kingdom. Harris Academy Falconwood".

"And finally, the winner of the 2019 Bexley Speak Out regional finals. Everyone give it up for..." "God's Favour Oluwanusin from Bexley Grammar School!"

The crowd roared and for the first time all night I was speechless as I ran up on stage to collect my certificate and plaque from Rt Hon Sir David Evennett MP.

I have thoroughly enjoyed the 'Speak Out' Challenge so far and I hope to continue on and win the Grand Finals held at the Cambridge theatre on 1st July: fingers crossed I make it to the final 16.

I'd like to thank Mr Husbands, the Speaker's Trust and the Jack Petchey organisation for giving young people, like me, the opportunity to speak out and be heard.

Japanese exchange at BGS

During the whole exchange, I got close to many students from our linked school, Keio High School and found it very hard on Sunday to see them leave, I hope they come to visit London again soon and that the students hosting next year will have a similar educational yet unforgettable experience.


Can You Help?
