Mrs Eacott and I are extremely proud to report back on what amazing jobs the Year 11 pupils did on their work experience placements. After many employers were keen to keep hold of them, we were pleased to see all the pupils return to Bexley Grammar School for the next phase of their GCSE studies.

The feedback from employers has been incredibly positive about the Year 11 pupils with many commending them for their punctuality, smartness, politeness and general work ethic. Pupils were praised for their maturity with employers shocked at their ages and ability to use their own initiative and adapt to the demands of the working environment. Employers have been quick to express their desire to have Bexley Grammar School pupils working with them in the future.

Placements were diverse and ranged from local primary schools to HMCTS Central Criminal Court to Falcon Flying Services. Mars Wrigley Confectionery, UK, The Royal Marsden Cancer Charity, Sky Sports and Corinthia Hotel London are examples of some other fantastic opportunities Year 11 enjoyed.

| Red:Attendance is between $86.9 \%$ or below. This is very worying, there are <br> serious concerns regarding your child's attendance and they are a <br> persistent absentee. This means the education welfare service may be <br> involved and if attendance does not improve you may be issued a penalty <br> waminanotice. |  |
