Our Ethos

Bexley Grammar School

The school community of Bexley Grammar School is guided by 3 key principles: 'Empathy, Intellect and Courage'.

As a new member of our school, it is important that you understand what these values mean and how to demonstrate them within your time at BGS.

EMPATHY means...

The ability to share someone else's feelings or experiences by imagining what it would be like to be in that person's situation.

This means that you are able to listen to others and consider how they may be feeling.

This is a key skill as it allows you to recognise and understand each other's strengths and weaknesses and develops the inclusive and accepting community we have at BGS.

This means that we...

- ★ accept each other for who we are.
- ★ listen to each other and accept that we may have different opinions
- ★ care about each other's feelings
- * are respectful to each other.

INTELLECT means...

The ability to understand and to think in an intelligent way.

Your role as a student is to engage with your teachers and the ideas that are being taught in your lessons. You do this by showing interest in each of your subjects. Showing intellect means that you put effort into developing your understanding of ideas and can explain them in your own words.

This is a key skill as it allows you to make progress in your subjects.

This means that we...

- * ask questions when we're not sure, to develop our knowledge.
- **work** to the best of our ability.
- ★ learn from our mistakes.

COURAGE means...

The ability to use your mental and moral strength to persevere in difficult situations.

This can sometimes make you feel nervous or worried, which are natural feelings to have. At Bexley Grammar School, we ask that you use your courage to try something new and challenge yourself to be your best.

This means that we can use our courage to...

- **put our hands up** in class to answer a question.
- **seek help** from a member of staff if we are worried or concerned.
- **try our best** as we begin new subjects for the first time.
- ★ make new friends.

Your task...

Create an acrostic poem for one of the words in our school ethos on a sheet on A4 paper. <u>An acrostic poem is a poem where each letter of the word starts the sentence</u>. It does *not* need to rhyme but the ideas mentioned should link to the word that you have chosen.

- 2) Then use your best handwriting to complete the sentence.
- 3) You should then add some colour and be ready to bring it into school on your first day in September.
