#### Celebrating Year 9 ILP Achievements

Here are some further great examples of ILP submissions by Year 9 students...well done to everyone, once again.

#### Can you make a self-propelled mode of transport out of Lego? (extract)

For my ILP, I wanted to take my love of Lego building and give myself the huge challenge of making a skateboard of my own design. This was a new challenge for me as I hadn't built anything of this size before let alone without instructions.

I started my research by looking into various building techniques I could employ to create the largest and strongest board possible. I also watched two different TV shows. One was a show called Lego Masters which gave me very advanced building techniques and the other was an episode of James May's Toy Stories in which he builds a full working house out of Lego which gave me techniques for building big. I looked at the different bricks and wheels which Lego made. I soon realised that I already had the largest wheels Lego made. I also researched the different types of skateboards and their different designs. This gave me some ideas for the shape of my skateboard.

I started out by separating all of my bricks to get the flatter ones that I would use to create the main base of my skateboard. I chose these bricks over the larger ones as I hoped that the final base would look better and be lighter.

Then I turned my attention to the wheels. I was mainly worried how I would attach the wheels and if they would be strong enough to support my weight.

I started off with a design that resembles that of a longboard

with the wheels on the sides of the board. I picked this design as I thought that it looked better than a regular skateboard. The only issue with this design was some of the parts that connected the wheels to the board kept bending outwards whenever I tried to push the board. I needed to add more support but not compromise my design.

In the end it is possible to create a self-propelled mode of transport out of Lego, in this case a skateboard. However, due to the fact that Lego does not make strong enough wheels to support someone's weight, it means that it would not be usable. The weight of a person on the board would pop the wheels out of place or compress the tyres too much so that the board cannot move.

I have found that this topic has been incredibly interesting to research, build and test even if in the end the skateboard didn't work. It has also been a difficult challenge to even try to make a stable build and now that I have done it I am quite proud.







#### FAO Parents of Year 8
