

# Recycling symbols

This guide from the Environmental Action Group explains common symbols found on packaging and what they mean for recycling, and can help you recycle at home!



Labels like these tell you the type of material and how widely they are recycled. This label tells you that the glass bottle is recyclable in over 75% of UK councils, meaning you can put it in your glass and plastic recycling.

This symbol shows that 20-75% of councils collect this type of item for recycling. Here, you should refer to your local council's guidance, available on their website. This plastic tray can be recycled with plastic and glass in the borough of Bexley.





This label shows that the item cannot be recycled in more than 80% of boroughs. You should refer to your local council's guidance, but in this case, the plastic film cannot be recycled in Bexley and should be disposed of in the general waste.

Certain types of plastic packaging are only available to recycle at supermarket carrier bag collection points. If you can't take these items to a collection point, they should be disposed of in general waste.





This symbol is used in many European companies to show that the producer has made a financial contribution towards the recovery and recycling of packaging. This doesn't necessarily mean that the item is recyclable.

The number indicates the type of plastic resin the item is made with.. Whether the item can be recycled is determined by this type of resin, but can differ between boroughs. Councils don't offer guidance on which plastics can be recycled in reference to this number.





This is a reminder to not litter, and doesn't tell us about whether an item can be recycled or not.

This indicates that an item can be recycled. However, it does not guarantee it can be recycled in your borough, or at kerbside.





Waste electrical items, from household appliances to mobile phones, can be recycled if you see this symbol. However, you need to check if it can be recycled at kerbside, or should be taken to local recycling centres.

These items are accepted for recycling at local centres. Refer to your council's guidance on these disposal points.
