Shakespeare's 'Romeo and Juliet' The Junior Production

To mark 10 years of performing Shakespeare's plays at Bexley Grammar School, the Junior Production presented "Romeo and Juliet". This was the first Shakespeare play performed at the school and a fitting way to celebrate this dedication to the bard was to perform it again! This heart-breaking story was performed by 54 Year 7-9s set in the 1920s era.

So many talented students auditioned for the show and as a result, we had a superb cast! They have risen to the challenge of learning and understanding Shakespeare's text to bring a fresh approach to the play. We also had many students across Years 9, 10 and 12 supporting the cast by directing scenes, designing and operating the lighting and the sound.

The cast had been rehearsing alongside a very busy school calendar since January and performed the "Glitz and Glamour" in five Performances over two days: Monday 23rd April (Shakespeare's Birthday and also the anniversary of his death!) and Tuesday 24th April. A shining performer in this production said: "I love the rehearsals because we get — to know each other as a cast

and have fun working together. It is really great to see the other cast members creatively build their characters and laugh whilst doing

it. Being a part of the cast has really shown

The first performance was to the whole of Year 9. They were mesmerised by the production and enjoyed the lively, shocking fight scenes: many students highly commended the theatrical spectacle. The play was also performed to two local primary schools- Danson Primary School and Hook Lane Primary School. The show captivated the audience ranging from Years 3- 6; this was shown from the questions they asked after the performance. The tour is a fantastic and challenging experience. One superb cast member "feels proud to be


The Globe Players perform Shakespeare at BGS





Parents' Association BGS Parents' Association (BGSPA) has yet again been able to secure reduced price ride wristbands for Adventure Island, Southend. Adventure Island is a great day out for all the family, with a wide choice of rides for all ages. Check it out at: www.adventureisland.co.uk

Although entry is free, purchase of a wristband is required for unlimited use of all suitable rides. Once purchased, a wristband can be used on any one

day in 2018 that Adventure Island is open. At peak times (weekends and school holidays), for anyone who is over 1.2 metres tall, a wristband would cost £22.50 if purchased online (£30 if purchased at the ticket office on the day). The PA can provide these for **only £18.00**. For those who are 1.2 metres tall, or less, we have wristbands for **only £12**, instead of the usual £18.75 online price (£25 if purchased at the ticket office on the day).
